#### Father Lameck's Message



#### Alleluia Christ is Risen!

All major events are known sounds of joy or sorrow but for the resurrection, there was silence. We consider the resurrection story as one of the greatest events in the Christian history. It changed the world but all was in silence. This is in sharp contrast to the noise we like to make to iust about anything, especially when silence is about our own human power. But the resurrection of the Son of Man was different. I often wonder what Jesus thought in that moment of sheer silence, as he sat up and waited for the stone to roll away. Well, his first word and first act was to meet Mary Magdalene, the first apostle and witness of the resurrection. His first action was to meet in person, to rebuild the relationship, to share the good news. And Mary's job, once she had recognised him, was to make him known. Imagine yourself, if you will for a moment, in the tomb of Jesus. You have died, and then slowly but suddenly, incredibly, you realise that the ultimate restriction placed upon you, our mortality has no power over you. This becomes a new dawn. There will be a realisation that your soul is cherished in a way that we could never comprehend or describe in this life. In silence, we will wonder. And then, in ways that we cannot yet know, all the restrictions we see in our world will be gone, the bands that tie us down will fall away, and we will be able to say 'I have seen the Lord' because he will be there beside you and me.

It is in following Jesus in this life that we have connection with the only true life. The life of the creator is about unity and sharing in the utterly real life of God. God's loving desire to share his own life with us is implicit in everything he does, from creating us to redeeming us. Life seems 'natural' to us, but it is a gift, reflecting the giver. We are loved into existence, and our continued existence is not our own doing but a demonstration of God's enduring relationship with us.

Knowledge about the resurrection transforms our world view, but then we have to turn back to the world which is devastatingly the same as it was. Restrictions are everywhere, holding back the poor, refusing the refugee, not helping the hurt, ignoring the sad. So as witnesses, we need to live lives now that reflect the resurrection. Lives that reject the injustice and the exclusive noise we make and replace them with relationships.

As Christians, we are called by name to help others hear Jesus calling their name and recognise the vast, free, unchanging, faithful love of God. When we shout 'Alleluia Christ is risen' this year, remember in your heart that 'He is risen indeed Alleluia' Let the silence of the risen Lord transform your life and bring healing to the fractured world.

#### **Ascension Day**

Thursday  $9^{\text{th}}$  May is Ascension Day, an important day in the church year. The Holy Communion will be celebrated at 7.30pm.

#### Whitsunday/ Pentecost

May 19th is Whitsunday, often, in the revised calendars of the churches, reverting to its older, Jewish name, of Pentecost. This is also an important day in the calendar and one which, since the abandonment in this country of the Bank Holiday which was once attached to it, has lost its public prominence. All who worship at St Alban's are urged to worship on this day, if at all possible.

#### **Trinity Sunday-26<sup>th</sup> May**

The Sunday following Whitsunday is called Trinity Sunday. It is a late-comer to the church year, dating only from the middle ages, and it was introduced in order to complete the round of the church year- those feasts and fasts by which we recall the significance of the life of Jesus are, Trinity Sunday reminds us, celebrations of a life significant because it is so designated by God.

#### St Alban's Day-June 23rd June

The church in Tattenhall is dedicated to St Alban who is considered to be the first English Christian martyr. Until the more popular St George came along he was considered to be the patron saint of England. Having met a Christian priest fleeing from the invading Romans (about 200AD) Alban gave him sanctuary in his home and as he got to know him, Alban was inspired to be converted to Christianity. When the Roman soldiers came to seize the priest, Alban put on his guest's cloak and presented himself to the soldiers. Despite being tortured Alban refused to give up the hiding place of the priest and he was executed. At the place where he died an abundance of wild flowers sprung up. Later, writing about St Alban's martyrdom, William of Newbury wrote, "of all the roses of the martyrs brightly shines Saint Alban". This year, St Alban's Day is June 23rd at 10.30 am and is commemorated with a rose.

#### **ALL SAINTS CHURCH, HANDLEY**

#### All Saints needs new 'Friends'

All Saints Handley is a Grade II\* listed building, of which the oldest part is the tower, built in 1512. It has many other significant features including the 17th century hammer beam roof which was left intact when James Harrison undertook a major restoration in 1854. The cost of maintaining such a building and its surrounds is immense, and The 'Friends of All Saints' was launched in 2006 with the object of raising money for specific projects for its restoration and repair. Business in our March meeting included the new telegraph pole installed by BT on Church Bank, which we consider to be inappropriate due to its location in the middle of a conservation area and a revered postcard view of our village. Representations are being made in order to have the pole re-sited in a better position.

A number of sites surrounding the current settlement boundary have been suggested as being suitable for development, including prime agricultural pasture. This is being thoroughly scrutinised by the parish council who are in the final stages of reviewing the neighbourhood plan before it goes out for public consultation.

It should also be noted that shops facilities such as the butchers and the beehive pub have come and gone in recent years, and there has also been atrocious flooding to contend with.

There is still a fundamental disagreement with Cheshire West and Chester Council over the £15,000 bill to change the fire alarms and doors to allow public access to and from the school community room. Our position is that we will not cover the cost as it was a mistake made by Cheshire West when the school building was expanded.

Work to refurbish the youth shelter with new exterior landscaping is due to take place subject to availability of labour.

Over £5,000 in grants is being

distributed to various community events and organisations including but not limited to the church, this year's art trail, the allotments (towards a new mower), bowling club (for essential refurbishment), the repair café, the Barbour Institute (for a new A3 printer), a new forest school in the grounds of the park primary as well as tools and raised planters for the children's garden project.

The biggest forthcoming event is the D -Day 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary commemorations this summer. A wartime-themed fish and chip supper with a bar will be held in the B.I. on the evening of **Friday 7 June** with all profits going to the Royal British Legion.

Rhoyda's window will have a period display over that weekend but interesting artefacts are always welcome to be put on show in the institute.

The Parish Council will hold its next meeting on Monday 9th May in the Barbour Institute. All residents are welcome to attend.

If you prefer to discuss your particular issue in private, a Councillor surgery takes place at 7.00pm before the main meeting.

#### **Update on Hera Schools Project 2023-2024**

#### Thank you Tattenhall!

The response to the plea to help make a difference to the youngsters at Father Lameck's home village in Zimbabwe has been immense. Previously we had been able to help with the purchase of a piece of land to establish an early year's learning unit and support the older girl's education through providing much needed sanitary supplies.

Two years on, we wanted to help again and our Advent Appeal for resources and supplies has been a great success. Three drums were packed straightaway, and we are now waiting for two more drums to send further donations. We are grateful to The Primary School PTA for the contribution of surplus uniform, the sewing group for making packs of reusable sanitary products, the generous donations of high-quality reading books from so many people and to local supermarkets who have given us substantial support for the girls. To everyone who has donated- thank you. You have made a difference!

The project to support the education of the youngest children goes from strength to strength and with generous donations and the commitment to build and extend the school from the community in Hera a new "Tattenhall Building" is now being completed. As well as a new classroom and toilet block, this building will also house a reading and literacy centre made up of the books generously donated by you. The girls' school has been thrilled to accept the donated sanitary products, including sets of reusable products sewn and assembled by a group of talented sewers at St Alban's.

Father Lameck was able to take and distribute some of the donations when he visited Hera in January. He was also able to supervise and help with the building of the new block and see the kitchen garden planted with corn, for feeding the children. As one village reaching out to another, thank you for making a difference to young lives.
